# 2. AUTHOR:

Ascribed by tradition (the Talmud) to <u>Jeremiah</u>, who possibly incorporated records made by Nathan and Gad (1 Chr. 29:29)

## 3. DATE:

- A. Covers approximately 120 years, from the death of David to the death of Jehoshaphat.
- B. Probably written between 600 and 580 B.C.

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B. To give the history of the <u>disruption</u> of the kingdom into two houses, two kingdoms and two dynasties with their declines.

- A. God's Throne is above all earthly thrones.
- B. <u>Kings</u> succeed or fail according to their relationship to the <u>heavenly</u> throne and their response to the Word of the lord through the ministry of the <u>prophets</u>.

#### 9. **SUMMARY**:

The book of 1 Kings covers the <u>glorious reign</u> of Solomon, the <u>dividing</u> of the kingdom after his death, and the history of the divided kingdom through the reigns of Ahab in the north (Israel) and Jehoshaphat in the south (Judah). All the kings of Israel and Judah lined up under two "standard men", <u>David</u> the <u>godly</u> king and <u>Jeroboam</u> the <u>ungodly</u> king.

#### 10. CHRIST SEEN:

Christ is seen as the <u>King</u> of <u>Peace</u> and <u>Glory</u>, the <u>Wisdom</u> of God (1 Cor. 1:30), the builder of God's <u>Temple</u> (Eph. 2:20-22), the "<u>Greater Than Solomon</u>" (Mt. 12:42) and <u>The Prophet</u> of God -- the <u>Word</u> made flesh (Jn. 1:140. His <u>Throne</u> is above all thrones: <u>King of Kings</u> and <u>Lord of Lords</u> (Rev. 19:16).
